Look/Say/Cover/Write/Check (put these into sentences) https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=du3incCU6X</p> <p><u>c</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">-<u>S</u>leep-<u>G</u>reen-<u>T</u>eeth	<p>Today we will start using our maths book that you were all hopefully able to collect yesterday.</p> <p>Open on page 30 and 31 The Farmyard and fill in the answers counting the different farm animals and colour in the page the correct colours.</p>	<p>Open Lesson 9 Cóta Nua and listen to the scéal then try the Luaschartaí section and try to guess the words from the picture. You may have to go back and relisten to the scéal to help you with the words.</p> <p>Complete page 44 and label the correct parts, use page 42 & 43 to help you.</p> <p>If your child has already completed it get them to make their own luaschartaí.</p>

Friday 15th June

<p>Today in English the children should use the yellow copy to draw a monster wearing clothes.</p> <p>Then label the clothes on your monster and then write 3 words or if able 3 sentences to describe your monster.</p> <p>Try a little spelling test with your child using the six words we've used this week to see how much they remember:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">-<u>Sheet</u>-<u>Feet</u>-<u>Sheep</u>-<u>Sleep</u>-<u>Green</u>-<u>Teeth</u>	<p>Today in maths the children can try complete page 45 in their Maths planet book. It's continuing on the topic of Data looking at what children eat for lunch. Complete sections B and C.</p>	<p>Open Lesson 9 Cóta Nua and listen to the scéal then do the 'ceisteanna'. We're asking the boys and girls to learn a new skill: learn how to fold clothes and pair socks, we've been talking about odd and even numbers in maths in school. Use questions like is there an even number of socks or an odd number of socks?</p>	<p>PE with Joe</p>
