Commonly Confused Words: Are vs. Our

Are and *our* sound may sound alike to some people, but they have totally different meanings.

Are is a verb meaning a state of being. It's a form of the verb *to be* and can be used with other verbs.

Example 1: They **are** happy.

Example 2: Jane and Tom **are** swimming in the pool.

Our is a possessive adjective meaning *belonging to us*.

Example 1: **Our** puppy is named Skipper.
