

A little bit of History

In 1920 the first Sisters who came to Irelandfour in all-three Italians and one English of Irish parents- started their work in Limerick, They held evening classes in the heart of the city for young girls and women who could not attend school during the day. They taught them literacy, maths, cookery, home management and religion as well as providing a welcoming and happy place. The Salesian Sisters have a long tradition of education in Limerick. During a time of great expansion in the 60's and 70's the wonderful work of the Sisters spread to various parts of Ireland including Bawnogue where a small community of Salesian Sisters live. How lucky is Bawnogue to have our own very Salesian Sisters living in our midst. At this time many sisters went as missionaries to work with the very poor in townships in South Africa and other parts of the world. Working with young people is the main focus of the Sisters' ministry where "Follow your Dream" is a familiar mantra

"We Salesian Sisters are signs of love, hope and joy for the young and all whom we encounter."
