Write about:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">- The Ingredients- The Equipment needed- The steps to make the pancakes. <p>Reading: continue with your Oxford Owls!</p>	<p>Subtraction:</p> <p>-Complete Pg.92 in your Planet Maths book.</p> <hr/> <p>Game: BANG BANG! <i>Playing only with subtraction today</i> (2 players, 1 quizzer)</p> <p>Step 1: 2 players stand back-to-back, cowboy shootout style.</p> <p>Step 2: Quizzer asks a question, such as 'what is 8-5 or 6-2?' etc..</p> <p>Step 3: The first player to turn, face their opponent, shout 'bang bang' and to give the answer wins the round.</p> <p>Step 4: This is then repeated until a number of points, decided at the start of the game, is reached.
