Back to School Reminders

Uniforms: Please ensure all jackets/jumpers/cardigans are labelled with your child's name to avoid mix-

ups during the year!

Pupil Insurance

You can still pay for insurance until **Friday 8th September** by going to Ms Neary. This covers any out of pocket expenses arising from an injury that a child might have whether in or out of school. The medical card will not cover the expenses involved if your child damages their teeth nor if they have a serious accident involving a loss of limbs. The cost is \notin 5.60 for 24-hour cover.

Parents' Association A.G.M.

Entering school on rainy days



We will no longer use the hall on rainy days. The children will instead line up outside their classrooms. There will be no need for parents or guardians to stay with them on the corridor as the

teacher on duty will be able to supervise them and the corridors are too small to accommodate parents and children at the same time.

There are two reasons for this change. Firstly, the hall is not always available and secondly there is the issue of children coming late to school and getting lost or confused because they cannot find their class.

Anyone can get delayed and it is always a case of better late than never!

The children rely on the adults to get them to school on time and I am appealing to everyone to make the extra effort to get the children to school on time.

Parking



Our neighbours in Ashwood have been in touch to say that motorists dropping off children to the school are blocking drive ways with their
